MEIJER STATE GAMES AYBT ROUND ROBIN Rules and Regulations

H.S.A.A. rules will apply except for the differences listed below.

Game Timing: Two 20 minute halves with a running clock. In both halves the clock will begin stopping on all dead balls with 2 minutes to go. If there is more than a 25-point spread in a game both coaches must agree to waive the stop clock during the last 2 minutes.

Play: All defenses and offenses are allowed. However, coaches need to pull their full court or half court press if ahead by 20 points or more. All trapping defenses are considered a press.

Overtime: There will be a 2-minute overtime in all games ending in a tie, one time out per team with no carryovers. A jump ball will start each overtime period. In the round robin, sudden death determines the outcome of the second O.T. In the single elimination tournament, teams will play 2 minute regulation overtimes until there is a winner.

Time Outs: Three (3) thirty (30) second time outs per half-NO carryovers.

Technical Fouls: of any sort will <u>not</u> be shot; 2 points will be awarded to the other team plus the ball at half court. A second technical and offending player/coach/fan is out of the gym. Fighting, abusive language, trash talk, taunting, and other abuse by players, coaches or fans will not be tolerated.

Timekeepers and Scorekeepers: Each team will be required to provide one <u>responsible adult</u> scorekeeper per game: Home team provides the game ball and keeps the official book. Visiting team operates the clock/ scoreboard.

*The AYBT Official Scorebook must remain at the scorer table. Please make sure to completely fill out the team name, coach name and the player roster and make sure the referee checks the roster of players.

RULES OF CHALLENGE FOR SINGLE ELIMINATION TOURNAMENT

- 1. Only the head coach (or coach in charge) of the team can challenge a player of another team. The challenge must be a "legitimate challenge in the interest of fair play."
- 2. There will be no challenges in the round robin play.
- 3. There is a challenge deposit of \$50. If the challenge is upheld, the \$50 will be returned. If the challenge is not upheld, the \$50 will not be returned.
- 4. The player being challenged must be on the team roster and played prior to Sunday tournament play. At registration HCAYB will collect the signed ROSTER/WAIVER/PERMISSION TO TREAT forms.
- 5. Challenge must occur prior to the tip off of the game in question. Challenge will be reported to one of the officials who will report it to the gym manager or one of the tournament directors.
- 6. The player must have age/grade verification (birth certificate, student ID, report card, yearbook, or other legitimate form of identification). Player will be allowed to play if birthday or grade level falls within the division requirements. The decision of the Tournament Director is final.

^{*}Punctuality Policy – A team arriving over 15 minutes late for the start time of a single elimination game will forfeit the game.
